Course Syllabus:

Morphology

- *Nomen*: the five noun declensions, two models of adjective declension, adjectival degrees of comparison.
- *Pronomen*: relative, demonstrative, personal, anaphoric, interrogative, and indefinite pronouns.
- *Numerus*: cardinal, ordinal and distributive numbers.
- *Verbum temporale*: indicative, subjunctive, imperative, infinitive, participle, supine, gerund, gerundive modes; present, imperfect, future, perfect, pluperfect, future perfect tenses; active and passive diatheses; deponent, irregular and defective verbs.
- *Adverbium*: adverbs ending in *-e* and in *-ter*; adverbial degrees of comparison, temporal adverbs.

Syntax

- Case syntax: use of all cases.
- Verb syntax: relative, temporal, causal, concessive clauses with the indicative; uses of the accusative and ablative supine; use and value of participles; infinitive propositions; *consecutio temporum* of the infinitive and subjunctive; independent subjunctive; *cum, ut, ne, quin, quominus* with the subjunctive; the hypothetical period; periphrastic active and passive.

Learn the 2500 most common words in Latin literature.
